General Scope of Construction Project:

In March of 2012, Diné was awarded the contract to construct new offices for the WIC Program of the Omaha Tribe of Nebraska. The program provides nutrition supplies and counseling for mothers and their children. Dine' provided a 1,824 square foot modular building and eighteen-car parking lot on a one acre site.

Site work for the project included clearing and grading, demolition of existing structures and pavements, underground utilities, concrete foundations and sidewalks, and asphalt paving on stone base. The modular building includes a waiting room, offices, work room, laundry, laboratory and restrooms. Site installed low voltage systems consist of fire alarm, intrusion detection and tele/data cabling. Special features of the modular building construction include metal roofing, security screens on all windows, a site-built porch and an ADA ramp.

The needs of the Omaha Tribe required that the project be completed on an expedited construction schedule. Dine' received the contract from the Omaha Tribe on March 27, submitted engineering drawings on April 12 and completed the project on June 1 – just sixty-six days after receipt of the contract.
